## Glory to you, Lord

Three days later there was a wedding in the village of Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there. Jesus and his disciples were also guests at the wedding. When they started running low on wine, Jesus' mother told him, "They're just about out of wine." Jesus said, "Is that any of our business, Mother—yours or mine? This isn't my time."

She went ahead anyway, telling the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Six stone water pots were nearby, used by the Jews for ceremonial washings. Each held twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus ordered the servants, "Fill the pots with water." And they filled them to the brim. "Now fill your wine flasks and take them to the host," Jesus said. And they did.

When the host tasted the water that had become wine (he didn't know what had just happened but the servants, of course, knew), he called out to the bridegroom,

"Everybody I know begins with their finest wines and after the guests have had their fill brings in the cheaper wine. But you've saved the best till now!"

This was the first sign Jesus gave, the first glimpse of his glory, at Cana in Galilee. And his disciples believed in him.
